Current Features

May 19 Is National Asian and Pacific Islander HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

This day focuses on the impact of HIV stigma among Asians, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders. From 2017 to 2021, Asians, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders accounted for 251 of the 22,204 people diagnosed with HIV in Florida. Of these, 85% were male and 65% were over 30 years old. Among this group, 71% acquired HIV through male-to-male sexual contact, 27% through heterosexual contact and 2% through other risks. Asians, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders accounted for 855 of the 120,502 persons with HIV living in Florida in 2021. Talking about HIV normalizes it, which helps fight stigma. Selection Criteria

1. Topic— chronic disease, maternal and child health, social determinants of health, etc.
2. Group— Alzheimer’s disease, diabetes, characteristics of infants, etc.
3. Indicators— diabetes deaths, cesarean births, families below poverty level
4. County— census tract and ZIP codes for selected county
5. Year Range— five-year ranges

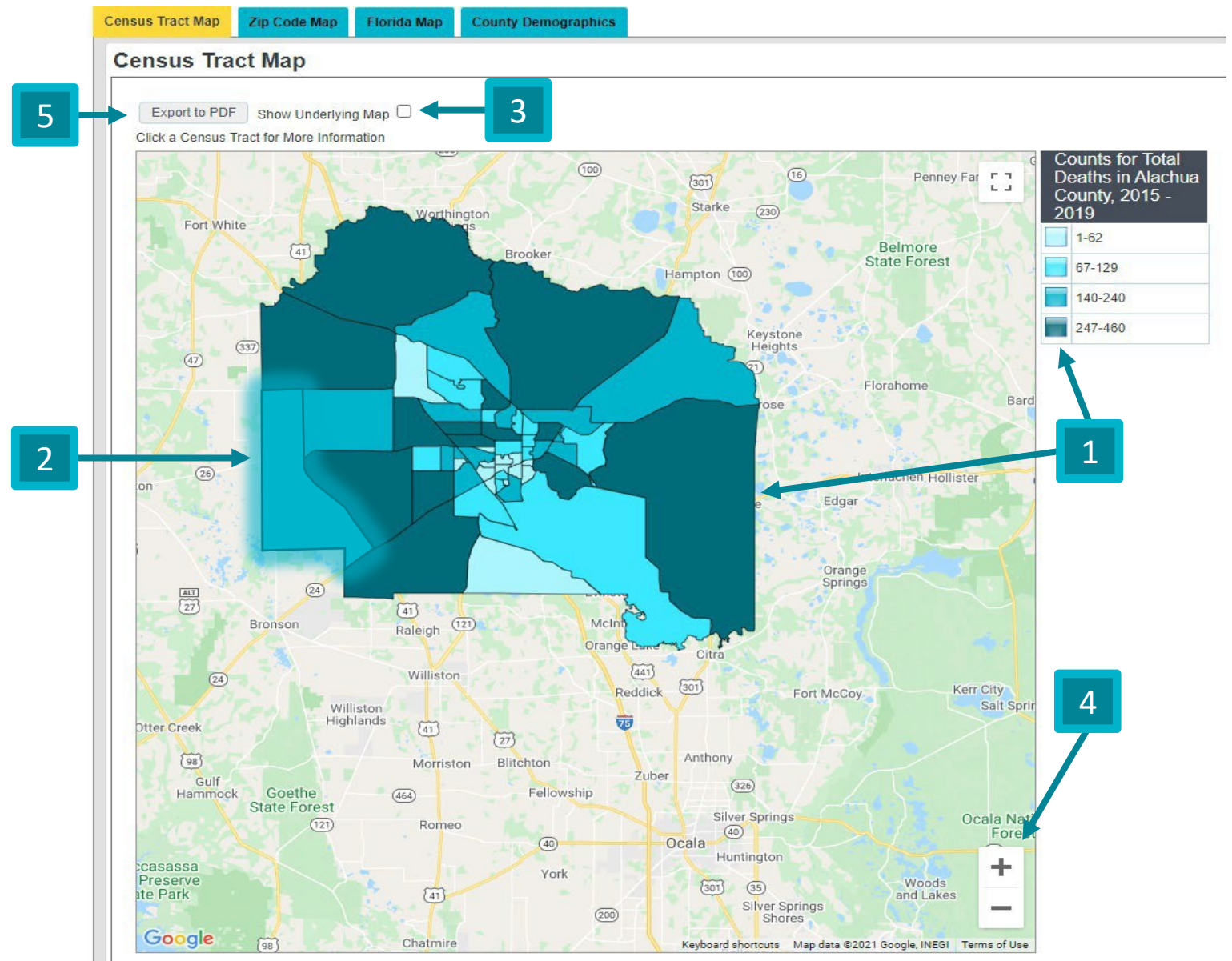

Census Tract Map

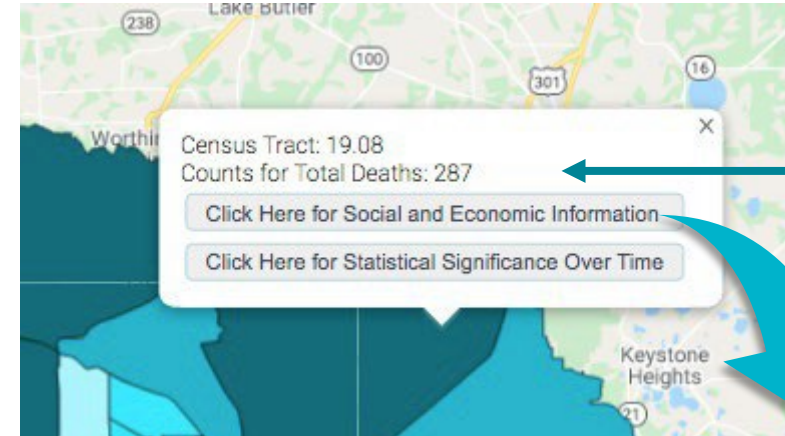

Quartiles: A Comparison Tool

- A number from 1-4
 - 1 is most favorable
 - 4 is least favorable
- Calculated by ordering percentages/rates from most to least favorable and dividing the list into four groups

Benefits

- For a single indicator, compare subcounty/county quartile to other subcounties/counties.
- Assess strengths (1st quartile) and opportunities (4th quartile).

Weaknesses

- Quartiles don't differentiate whether most subcounties/counties have similar or widely different rates.

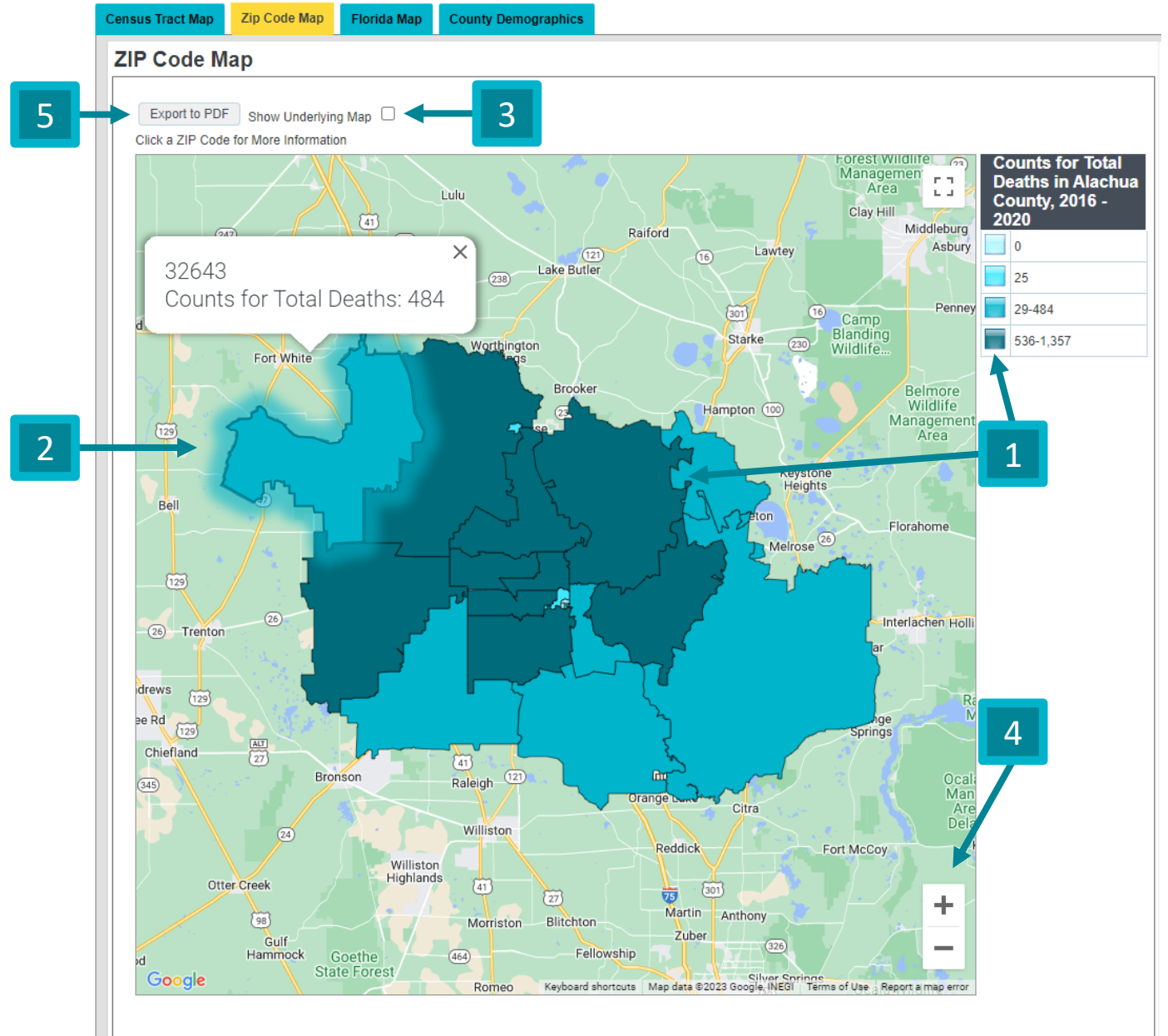

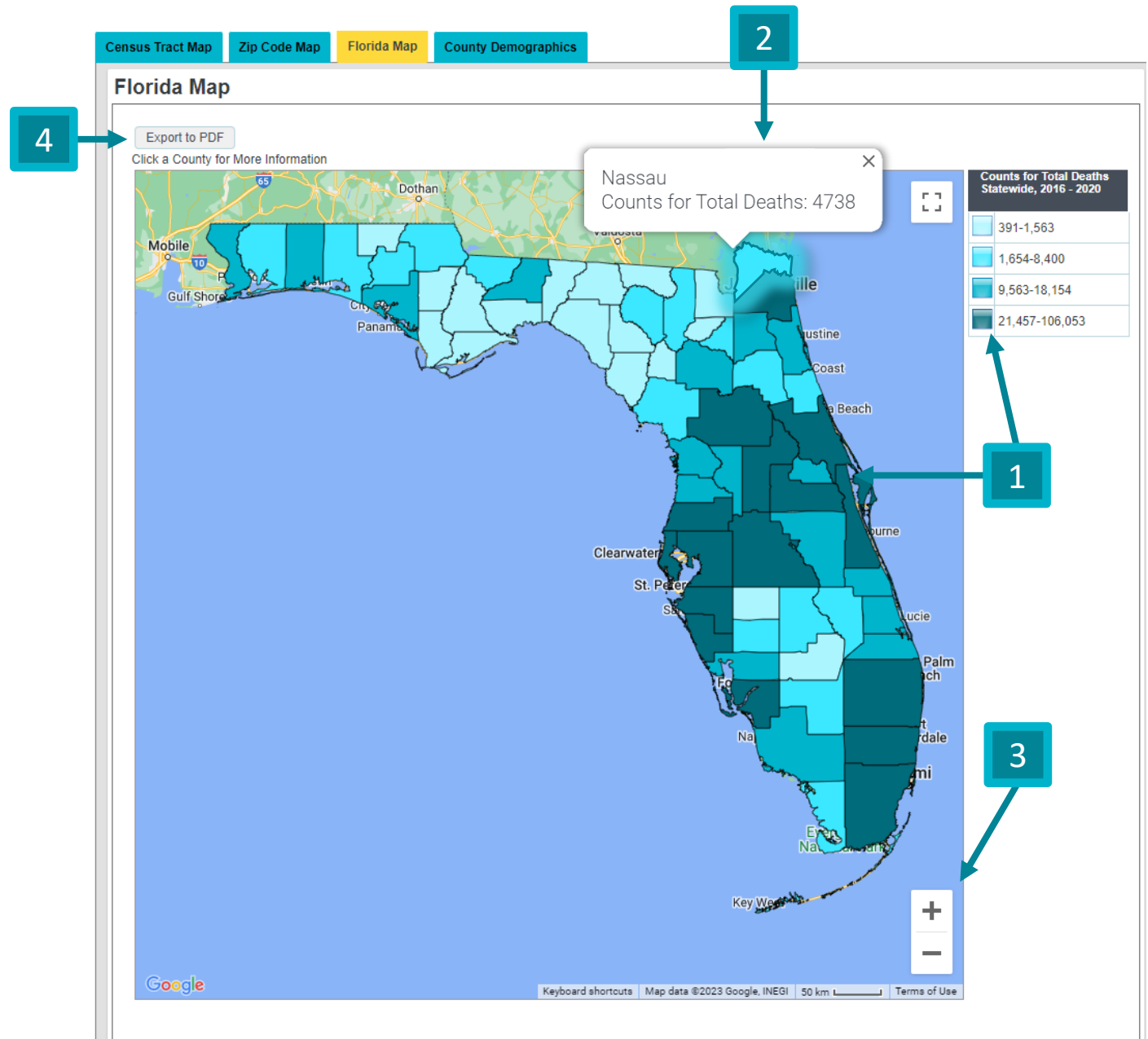

4. Export to PDF to print or save map

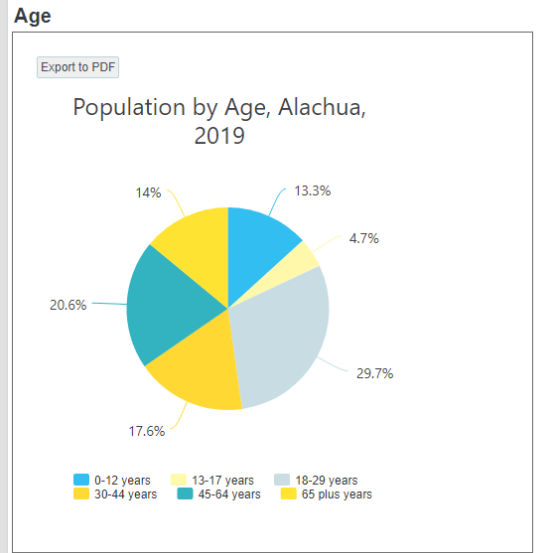


County Demographics

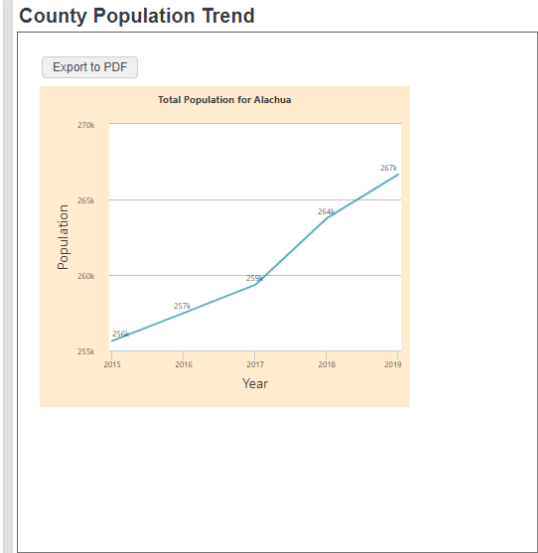

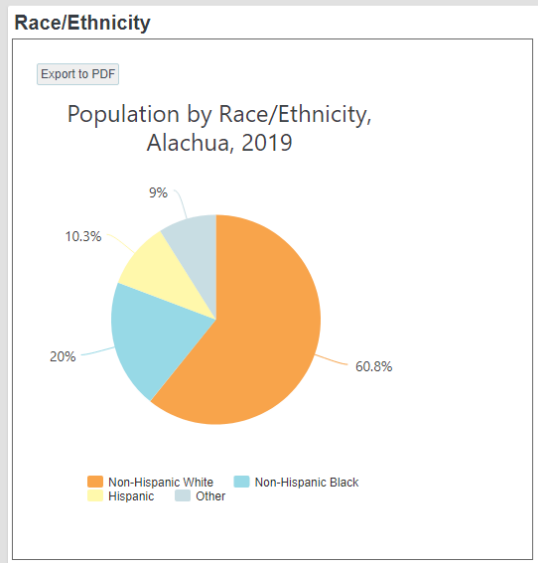
